WELCOME!!

The **Lesser Slave Lake** Region is wonderful for birding. There are a diversity of habitats with associated bird species.

Boreal Mixedwood forest, which includes mature forest, riparian habitat, wetlands and clearings is found at lower elevations. Higher up, the **Lower Foot-hills Ecoregion and Old Growth forest**. Occurs on Marten Mountain in Lesser Slave Lake Provincial Park. Don't forget the waterbirds along the extensive lake-shore!

The Lesser Slave Lake Bird Observatory (LSLBO) receives a high concentration of migratory **songbirds** because of its special location. Lesser Slave Lake is not only a major landmark, but the lakes and nearby Marten Mountain act as natural barriers to migrant birds. This "**Point Pelee effect**" funnels a great many birds through the narrow lowlands along the East lakeshore. In fact, **249 species of birds** have been recorded in the LSLBO vicinity to date!

Important Bird Area

Lesser Slave Lake have been recognized as an Important Bird Area of Global Significance by BirdLife International. Large numbers of **Western Grebes** nest on the lake. Additionally, 2% of the western population of **Tundra Swans** stage and feed on Lesser Slave Lake During their spring and fall migrations. The incredible concentration of migratory songbirds is also significant.

This checklist includes the 249 bird species know to occur in the LSLBO vicinity. The Checklist follows the taxonomic order and nomenclature according to the American Ornithologist's Union (A.O.U.).
